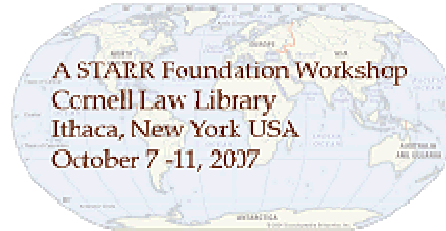

Cornell Johnson Museum of Art. Viewing of two Tibetan Buddhist mandalas, created on the occasion of the visit of the Dalai Lama.

Ithaca is the North American Seat of the Personal Monastery of His Holiness the Dalai Lama, and hosts the Namgyal Monastery Institute of Buddhist Studies. The Dalai Lama will be visiting Ithaca in October, and to celebrate his visit, two Tibetan Buddhist mandalas, representing dwellings for temporarily housing Tantric Buddhist deities, will be created by monks from the Namgyal Monastery in Dharamsala, India. A large Kalachakra mandala will be drawn using colored sand, while the other mandala will be a three-dimensional construction of colored string.
